- Every **sentence** has **two** parts.
- Every sentence has a **subject** and a **predicate**.
- The **subject** of a sentence is whom or what the sentence is about.
- The **subject** can be one word or more than one word. **The buildings** are tall. **The office buildings** are tall.
- The **predicate** of a sentence tells what the subject does or is.
- The **predicate** can be **one** word or **more** than one word.
- Sentence: The penguins **walked across the snow**.
- Predicate: **walked across the snow**.
